## Sex Worker Networking Zone

## Global Village, 23<sup>rd</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> June.

PROUD, ICRSE, SWAN and NSWP will be organising the Sex Worker Networking Zone in the Global Village, which is a space for sex worker-led organisations from across the world to network and present their work. The full title is: "Sex Workers Networking Zone: calling out the impact of punitive laws, policies and practices on HIV vulnerability through amplifying the lived experiences and voices of sex workers". It will include a daily programme of events.



We are calling for sex worker-led organisations to submit proposals to run a session in line with the theme of 'calling out the impact of punitive laws and policies' in the daily programme. Sessions should not be longer than one hour and can include presentations of your organisation's work on challenging punitive laws, chat shows about impact of punitive laws in different countries, performances or films.

Please send your proposal in English (maximum 500 words) including:

- details of your proposed session and what you hope it will achieve,
- the number of people involved,
- the materials required, and
- the proposed length of the session

### Sex worker-led Workshop

PROUD, ICRSE, SWAN and NSWP will be hosting a workshop on *the Impact of Punitive Laws, Policies and Practices on Sex Workers' Vulnerability to HIV* in the Global Village. It will provide opportunities for sex worker-led organisations to share successful strategies and best practices on challenging punitive laws, policies and practices. It will present examples from each of the 5 NSWP regions (Africa, Asia Pacific, Europe, Latin America, North America & Caribbean).

## Sex worker-led Satellite

PROUD, ICRSE, SWAN, NSWP and Aidsfonds Sex Work Team will be hosting a Satellite on the *Impact of Punitive Laws, Policies and Practices on Sex Workers' Vulnerability to HIV and Respect of their Human Rights* in the main Conference. The satellite will provide an opportunity for five sex workers, one from each of NSWP's regions, to present sex worker's lived experiences of current legal frameworks and recommendations to policy makers to ensure their human rights are protected.
